



He is the author of numerous research and theoretical publications, including *Tower and Office: From Modernist Theory to Contemporary Practice* (2005), *Isla-Ciudad* (2004) and *Recycling Madrid* (2001). His projects have been widely published, and have been exhibited at venues including the MoMA. His built works include the Usera Library (Madrid), the Valdemingomez Recycling Plant (Madrid), a studio for Luis Gordillo (Madrid), the Environmental Education Center in Arico (Tenerife) and a building for the University of Extremadura. Iñaki Ábalos was the 1995-96 Buell Book Fellow, and has taught at Columbia University, the Architectural Association of London, and EPF Lausanne.
